A Look at Our Learning

Reading Workshop – We will begin our Non-fiction unit. The kids will learn about the importance of text features and the skills needed to tackle non-fiction text. We will use strategies like clarifying, questioning, predicting and summarizing to help in navigating our non-fiction articles and books. **Writer's Workshop** – We will begin our Persuasive Writing Unit next week. Writing a Personal Essay is a favorite of most writers in third grade. Students are learning the recipe of a Personal Essay. Introduction – (Hook/lead, Thesis statement, Reasons), 2-3 Body Paragraphs – (Topic Sentence, 2-3 details explaining the details, Closing Sentence that restates the topic sentence), and Conclusion – (Hook/lead, Restates thesis, Restates reasons and Final thought to the reader). After choosing a topic they are passionate about, the students' essays will come to life.

Mathematics – Our next math unit is Travel Stories and Collections. It focuses on place value, addition and subtraction with larger numbers. The concept of regrouping will be reviewed. We will learn multiple strategies to solve more challenging problems and continue explaining our thinking using words. Students will focus on writing and solving two-step problems with regrouping.
Science - Our first science unit is titled Weather and Climate.. For this unit students will be getting outside to conduct experiments and observations. We will also explore ways to collect information about weather and climate to help students investigate how weather-related hazards can be reduced.
